BOOKSTORE AT FAIRWAY With great joy, Brianna King, Library Manager, announced at the October Friends Board meeting that a Bookstore extension at the Fairway Branch had been approved by the County Board. A motion was approved to spend up to \$1,500 to set up and maintain the Friends Bookstore extension. Additional shelving and lighting will be needed. LIBRARY NEWS At the Board meeting, Brianna also:

- 1. thanked the Friends for the 125 flash drives bought by the Friends. The drives are used for customers who find an important need for them. 25 of the 150 purchased drives were retained for the Friends.
- 2. announced that the Libraries will be closed Friday, December 24, and Friday, December 31.
- 3. shared that October is Domestic Violence Prevention month, and the Libraries are taking donations of new items for Eve's Place.

- 4. stated no date has been set for start-up of in-person programs.
- 5. told that her staff will be doing a virtual program at 5:00 p.m., Thursday, October 28, called the Great British Bump Off.
- 6. Although no new Library volunteers are being accepted now, they will be welcome when the Libraries return to in-person programs.

BOOKSTORE BLURBS. Half price specials for October are soft cover novels and audio books.

November half-price specials will include Christmas books, CDs, craft books, and soft cover books.

\$400 was received from a vendor who bought boxes of the Bookstore's older books. \$100 was received as a donation from a patron.


Sheila Rooney, RCSC Representative to the Friends Board, passed on kudos to former Friends President, Marcia Davis, for her work done on the RCSC website.

Some people seem to have aged like fine wine. I aged like milk ... I got sour and chunky.


I still have a full deck; I just shuffle and deal slower.

Crafter's philosophy ... why pay \$7 for it when you can make it with \$92 of craft supplies?


