

Dear Kent.

Workroom is right, Kent! Work goes on back there, a lot of work. Let me briefly explain what all our dedicated volunteers do to have the best used bookstore in our area (so says Tom E in his most biased voice).

When items are donated, they are put in the storage room down the hallway from the Bookstore. As time allows and space becomes available, those materials are moved to the workroom where they are processed.

Every book is evaluated. A scanning system is used to determine if the

book has significant value. If the book is in good shape, it is priced and shelved in the workroom until space is available on Bookstore shelves. If the book is determined not needed because of subject or duplication, it is donated to another non profit organization. If the book is in non readable condition, it is placed in our recycle bin.

DVDs and CDs are cleaned, reviewed for topic and quality, shelved, or donated.

Puzzles are put together to make sure all the pieces are there. I'm just kidding, Kent, to make sure you are still paying attention. The puzzles are reviewed for quality, however, to make sure the buyer will be satisfied.

All donations are inspected carefully to make sure everything is in good order. Quality is very important to our Bookstore Manager, Mary Anne McDonald. That pride is conveyed to volunteers who demonstrate it to book lovers who come to our Bookstore. With that pride, the quality of our materials, and a joy of assisting patrons, we believe we have a winning combination!
