LIBRARY NEWS Our Libraries are going to begin having in-person programs, after COVID concerns caused them to stop. The limited, low key start-up programs will be small classes, capped at 12 people. Masks will be required for all in-person programs. Virtual programs will continue.

The BinaxNOW COVID-19 Antigen Self-Test nasal swab tests to detect COVID-19 infection are still available at both Libraries. The kits may be obtained by curbside pickup, or by requesting Library staff to meet them outside as they exit the Library.

Brianna King, Library Manager, is working with RCSC to get a permanent parking lot sign for curbside pickup.


