To establish connections and partner with area Community Colleges and/or Universities where we can recruit media and Website designer majors to intern with us. This is such a doable achievement! An internship with young, progressive minds can be a win/win scenario where they earn credit and we benefit from their skills and work on our website! (P.S. I have presented this idea to D and if this is not an idea suitable for this specific meeting, we feel strongly about proceeding with it at another time that you see fit). Some area colleges are: Ottowa University in Surprise; Estrella Mountain College, a Maricopa Community College; Glendale Community College, Grand Canyon College, and others still to be googled!

B. To work or partner with area Hospice or Meals on Wheels to develop a reading program for appropriate homebound members. We would have volunteers

reading to the sick, elderly or dying homebound in their homes.

C. To partner with the Chamber of Commerce in welcoming new residents. We could include a brochure and promotional information to welcome and introduce new families to our libraries and Bookstore.

D. To apply for Grant monies to get and maintain a BookMobile (and pay a driver) to deliver books to homebound families.

E. Electronic Book Buddies: Introduce and provide electronic access (ereaders) to those who are homebound. Provide training for how to use said devices.

F. Utilize younger age groups in our endeavors, e.g. many groups like Honor Society require community service hours.

G. Sponsor an event where people can sign up for a library card (besides at the library).

H. Have some kind of community get together

I. Create a program that can help schools read to children

J. Create a program that helps schools teach or help kids to read

K. Continue with the "honor" book shelf project at Fairway,,,,,& investigate the possibility of moving the existing one at Bell out of the hallway space and into the Library space. If Bell Library could give us some space even on a short term basis we would then have a "system-wide" honor book shelf program to advertise.
