LIBRARY UPDATE Not much in the way of change in operation has taken place recently. As Brianna King, Library Manager, said, it is "business as usual." The January customer count at the Sun City Library was 5,152, as compared to over 14,000 in January, 2020.

Library volunteers probably will not return to work for some time. The Maricopa County Library District has not set a return date.

Hand sanitizer stands have been purchased for the Library and Bookstore. The Friends of the Library provided the funds.

2020 HIGHLIGHTS, FROM YOUR PRESIDENT Because we closed the Bookstore on March 16, and canceled most of our activities and services for the rest of 2020, we likely think that the past year was unproductive. It gives me great pleasure to share with you some of the events and projects that we were able to accomplish:

Rich Hoffer was assigned as the RCSC liaison to the Friends, replacing Sue Wilson. Board member Jerry Walczak resigned on May 28, after a long association with the Friends.

A Volunteer Mingle with a Valentine theme was held on February 7 in The Gathering Place.

Marcia Davis, past president, designed t-shirts for all 120+ Friends of the Library volunteers. She also canvassed each volunteer as to style and size, collated the order and submitted it to the company. She made great spreadsheets on the project, so that the shirts could be distributed at the planned March Volunteer Dinner. deserves major credit for making this happen.

Board members and others staffed a Friends booth outside the Sun City Branch Library on Saturday, February 28, for the Bell Recreation Center Spring Fling.

The Board did not meet in April or May, but met monthly beginning in June using Zoom, an internet conferencing tool.

Donations of \$1,000 each were made to the Sun Cities Area Historical Society and to the Octogenerian Golf Tournament. We have supported these projects in the past.

A comprehensive evaluation of accepting credit cards in the Bookstore was done, with the Board deciding not to allow credit card purchases at this time.

The Friends planned and carried out a multiple-day honoring of two very special volunteers: Mary Anne McDonald and Sue Painter. Because the March Volunteer Appreciation Dinner had to be canceled, the ladies were treated to flowers, chocolates,

wine, a singing telegram, a card shower, and a car parade in early September.

The Book Buddy program was mostly put on hold during the pandemic. The safety of our volunteers is most important.

An email list of Bookstore customers was resurrected and built upon, by board member Irene Nathanson, so that when the Bookstore reopens, we can communicate about special promotions and other key aspects of the store.

A Bylaws change was made to allow board members to extend their terms in light of the pandemic.

The Book Friends were unable to read to memory care residents, starting in March, due to the pandemic. It is unknown whether this program will be restarted when the pandemic ends.

A major project was begun in 2020 and continues into 2021 to evaluate the 12 or more boxes of financial and other club records. Ultimately a new record retention policy will be compiled. The goal is to consolidate

and decrease the amount of records retained in physical form.

A Holiday gift bag for each volunteer, which included their new t-shirt, candy, a lovely painted rock, and more was delivered by board members in December.

The board continues to financially support our branch libraries, with funds going for supplies, other resources, and programs.
