AMAZON PREFERRED CHARITY

The Friends of the Sun City Libraries, Inc. are now an Amazon Preferred Charity. A portion of on-line sales from Amazon can be donated quarterly to the Friends. Their policy is to give .5% of their sale proceeds to charitable organizations. If your individual Amazon account is linked to the Friends, the proceeds come to the Friends quarterly.

Enrolling is done by use of the site "Smile.Amazon" wherein you establish your existing account or open a new account and choose the Friends. On the very first screen of your new account and under the banner that says, "Welcome (your name)," there will be a drop-down box to "SC AZ." There are three Friends of Sun City Libraries choices--SC AZ (that is us), SC,CA, and SCW, CW,AZ.

Subsequent Amazon shopping must be done by logging in through your Smile. Amazon account. There is no difference in shopping through Smile. Amazon and any other Amazon access you might use. By using your Smile. Amazon account, you are linked to the Friends. Amazon will automatically retrieve and link all your

previous order history, lists, searches, and favorites to your Smile account.

MORNINGSTAR SUBSCRIPTION

Jeremy Reeder, Deputy Director of the Maricopa County Library District (MCLD), and Andrew Tucker, MCLD Communications Director, reported at the May Friends Board meeting that the Morningstar subscription got off to a late start and only became available in October, 2018. There have been 14,886 searches since launch, with a quarter of those searches originating MCLD will do from library facilities. outreach during the summer months to improve usage. The Friends donated money to finance the first year of the program.

LIBRARY LATE FEES Jeremy also announced that as of May 22, 2019, MCLD will no longer charge late fees. This has been a trend in other libraries. Borrowers will be notified after 31 days that the borrowed item needs to be returned or paid for. Failure to comply will result in blocked accounts.

BOOKS AROUND THE CORNER The annual Father's Day sale will be Monday, June 10 through Saturday, June 16. All male authored books, hardback or paperback, will be half price.



BOOK BUDDY Monica Fallon, Board member and Book Buddy chairperson, reported at the May Board meeting that she has five new drivers and is hoping to add a sixth shortly. She is continuing to make contact with adult residences and day-care facilities. Enrolling more men in the program is another of her goals.

BOOK FRIENDS Charlotte Klose, Board member and Book Friends chairperson, has recruited Linda

McKnight to assist with launching of a reading program at a second memory care facility. More information will follow after program implementation.

NEW BOARD MEMBERS Cathy Weyers, Board member and Board Development chairperson, is still looking for persons interested in being Board members. With a six year limit on the Board, turnover is continual. Change brings new ideas, but causes continual recruiting needs.

SUMMER READING PROGRAM

Beginning June 1, participants can start logging their summer reading activities for food rewards at Peter Piper Pizza and Rubio's Coastal Grill. People who log 1,000 points can choose a free book from an online marketplace, while supplies last. Participants can earn one point per minute for reading physical or electronic books (including graphic novels), listening to audiobooks, and also for attending library events, completing online challenges and

participating in <u>community</u> <u>experiences</u>.

This year's theme is "A Universe of Stories," which encourages participants to explore outer space and exercise their minds by reading at least 20 minutes a day. Participants can earn online badges to keep a healthy competition with family and friends. Challenge your grandkids!



"Our summer reading program is fun but it is also the one of the County's major community literacy efforts," said Cindy Kolaczynski, Maricopa County Library District Director and County Librarian. Even if participants cannot make it to the library, they can use electronic books and audio books to get points.

The program runs through August 1 in more than 60 public libraries
