- Attend virtual programs for all ages from libraries across the County with MCLD Now!

In the meantime, some volunteers will be doing book culling, sorting and reorganizing, as well as determining needed changes as a result to the pandemic.

The air-conditioning is being turned on at least two hours a day for book protection.

BYLAW CHANGE At the August 13 Friends Board meeting, a Bylaw was changed related to term limits of Board members. Because of the pandemic, Board members have had limited or no activity. In addition, recruitment of new Board members has been impossible. As a result, the

Board voted unanimously to extend the time a member is on the Board when there is a pandemic or catastrophe.

Section 5.3.1 of the Bylaws now reads, "A Director will serve no more than six years except when a pandemic or catastrophe, as determined by the Board, occurs. In that case a Director's term may be extended commensurate with the length of such occurrence."

For example, if this pandemic lasts for 11 months, all current Board member terms would be extended for 11 months.
